《リスニングテスト1》

なお、会話は続けて2度読みますが、a, b, c の選択肢は1度しか読みません。

- b. You must finish it right now.
- c. We can do our homework together.

A: My volleyball game is this Saturday.

B: Oh, I'm free on Saturday, so can I come to watch?

A: Sure! The game starts at 10:00 in the gym.

- a. Sorry, I'm busy that day. I hope you win!
- b. Don't worry. I'm good at volleyball.
- c. Great! I'll come early to find a good seat.

今から、日本からの留学生エリさんと医者のお話を聞きます。問題用紙に印刷されていると医者のカルテと問題に目を通しながら聞いて下さい。会話は2度読みますが、質問は読まれません。では、10秒後に始めます。

D: Hello, it's Eri Yamada, right? I'm Dr. Smith.

E: Yes, that's right. Nice to meet you.

D: Nice to meet you, too. So, what seems to be the problem?

E: Recently, I had a fever but I feel better now. However, my skin here has been red for a week.

D: Could you please take off your jacket and roll up your sleeves and show me?
